Round Five - What's the Year

The following questions give three clues to a year between 1990 and 2011 inclusive, one from current affairs, one from popular culture and one from the world of sport. 3 points for the exact answer, 1 for a year either way, and 1 for a pass.

- 1a:** The Maastricht Treaty is signed, leading to the creation of the Euro; short-lived soap Eldorado first airs on BBC 1; the 98th Five Nations Championship is won by England, who complete the Grand Slam. What's the year? **1992**
- 1b:** Air France Flight 447, en route from Rio de Janeiro to Paris, crashes into the Atlantic Ocean, killing all 228 on board; Alesha Dixon replaces Arlene Phillips as one of the judges on Strictly Come Dancing; the ICC World Twenty20 is held in England and won by Pakistan. What's the year? **2009**
- 2a:** A party of Chinese cockle pickers is caught by the tides at night in Morecambe Bay, drowning 23 people; Facebook, the social networking is launched in February of this year; Maria Sarapova becomes the second youngest tennis player to win Wimbledon, defeating Serena Williams. What's the year? **2004**
- 2b:** The Channel Tunnel opens in May, with the first passenger service running in November; Scottish group Wet Wet Wet release a cover of "Love Is All Around", which then spends 15 consecutive weeks at number 1; Ayrton Senna and Roland Ratzenberger lose their lives at the San Marino Grand Prix. What's the year? **1994**
- 3a:** The oil tanker Sea Empress runs aground in south-west Wales, spilling 73,000 tonnes of crude oil; The English Patient wins the Best Film BAFTA; the Grand National is won by Rough Quest. What's the year? **1996**
- 3b:** In Northern Ireland, David Trimble of the Ulster Unionist Party meets Gerry Adams of Sinn Féin, the first such meeting between Republicans and Loyalists since 1922; Anthony Gormley's landmark sculpture, the Angel of the North, is erected at Gateshead; Lindsay Davenport wins the US Open, her first Grand Slam. What's the year? **1998**
- 4a:** London is chosen as the host city for the 2012 Olympic Games; Shayne Ward tops the charts at Christmas with "That's My Goal"; Hedgehunter wins the Grand National. What's the year? **2005**
- 4b:** Ken Livingstone is elected Mayor of London; Bob the Builder is Christmas number one with "Can We Fix It?"; Papillon wins the Grand National. What's the year? **2000**
- Spare:** Falkirk Wheel boat lift opens in Scotland, also marking reopening of the Union Canal for leisure traffic; pop group Girls Aloud is formed on the reality TV show Popstars: The Rivals; football club AFC Wimbledon is formed after the FA allows Wimbledon F.C. to relocate 56 miles north to the Milton Keynes. **2002**
