3A. What is the standard two-letter abbreviation for state B? (**CA** – it's California)

3B. What is the standard two-letter abbreviation for state D? (**FL** – it's Florida)

- 4A. Which letter represents the state abbreviated to NM? (**F** – it's New Mexico)
- 4B. Which letter represents the state abbreviated to NV? (**G** – it's Nevada)

- 2B. Vocalist with US band Aerosmith. (Steve **TYLER**)
- 3A. US singer-songwriter, pianist and harmonica player whose albums include "Talking Book" and "Innervisions". (Stevie **WONDER**)
- 3B. Vocalist and keyboard player with The Spencer Davis Group, Traffic, and Blind Faith. (Steve **WINWOOD**)
- 4A. Vocalist and guitarist with a US band whose albums include "The Joker" and "Fly Like An Eagle". (Steve **MILLER**)
- 4B. Member of US band Buffalo Springfield before teaming up with David Crosby and Graham Nash in late '68. (Stephen **STILLS**)

A round of coups, revolutions and transfers of power!

1A. Which Ugandan President was deposed by Idi Amin in a military coup in 1971, but subsequently returned to power in 1980? (Milton **OBOTE**)

1B. Which Cuban dictator was ousted by Fidel Castro in the 1959 revolution? (Fulgencio **BATISTA**)

2A. Who was the Marxist President of Chile toppled in a 1973 coup by General Augusto Pinochet? (Salvador **ALLENDE**)

2B. Nicknamed “Bébé Doc” (his father and predecessor was “Papa Doc”), who was President of Haiti from 1971 until overthrown by a popular uprising in 1986? (Jean-Claude **DUVALIER**)

3A. Who came to power in Spain in 1936 during the Spanish Civil War and remained Head of State until his death in 1975, when the monarchy was restored? (Generalissimo Francisco **FRANCO**)

3B. Which Emperor of Ethiopia was deposed by the military in 1974, died the following year, and was viewed as a messianic figure by his followers, who referred to him by his previous title of Ras Tafari? (**HAILE SELASSIE**)

4A. Who, from 1989 to 1994, was the last President of South Africa under the Apartheid regime, and authorised the release of Nelson Mandela from prison? (Frederik Willem **DE KLERK**)

4B. Who was Prime Minister of Rhodesia (formerly Southern Rhodesia) from 1964 onwards, until the Internal Settlement of 1979 paved the way for black majority rule? (Ian **SMITH**)

Spares:

S1. Religious figure who became Supreme Leader of Iran on his return from exile following the 1979 revolution which overthrew the Shah of Iran, Mohammad Reza Pahlavi? (Ayatollah **KHOMEINI**)

S2. Army General who became Chief Executive, and later President, of Pakistan after ousting Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif’s government in 1999. He was considered a key ally by the West in the “war against terror”. He resigned in 2008. (Pervez **MUSHARRAF**)

4A. US President Franklin D. Roosevelt was crippled by which disease? (**POLIO**)
