- 1a Actor, 1935-2007. Played Mr Humphries in the BBC sitcom "Are you being Served".

- 1b Actor, born 1935. Played landlord of The Rovers Return, Alec Gilroy, in Coronation Street.
Roy **BARRACLOUGH**
- 2a Classical contralto, 1912-1953. Much loved for her recordings of Handel, Bach and Mahler but also, her interpretation of English folksongs, most famously "Blow The Wind Southerly".
Kathleen **FERRIER**
- 2b Musician, 1922-1978. "The Man with the Golden Trumpet". Had No 1s in Dec 1953 with "Oh, Mein Papa" and in Apr 1955 with "Cherry Pink and Apple Blossom White".
Eddie **CALVERT**
- 3a Sometime actor and TV presenter. First made his name as Steven Taylor, a time-travelling companion of Dr Who in 1965/66 before becoming a regular presenter of BBC's Blue Peter.
Peter **PURVES**
- 3b Born 1980, singer with Brit Award-winning group Liberty X. Cricketer Kevin Pietersen's other half. (Mrs Pietersen will not be accepted!)
Jessica **TAYLOR**
- 4a Film-maker and animator, born 1958, creator of Wallace and Gromit.
Nick **PARK**
- 4b Lancashire and England cricketer, born 1977, ambassador for the big man's fashion brand, Jacamo.
Andrew **FLINTOFF**
