1A ANCIENT

The Browns, a US folk/pop band had a No 1 hit in 1959 about little Jimmy Brown. What was its title?

Marty Robbins recorded the 1st song in the 1960's to reach No.1. What was its title?

A. 'Leaving on a Jet Plane', Peter, Paul and Mary

4A MODERN

This song by Alicia Keys and another from October 2009 was written as a tribute to both artists' home town of New York. Name the song and the co-star. 1 point for 1, 3 for 2, both needed for a pass.

A. 'Empire State of Mind', Jay Z

4B ANCIENT

This 1960 song was the theme music from a 1959 romantic drama film directed by Delmer Davies and starring Richard Egan and Dorothy McGuire. It remained at No 1 for 9 weeks in 1960. Name the artist and the song. 1 point for 1, 3 points for both, both needed for a pass.

A. Percy Faith, Theme from a Summer Place

4B MODERN

This song was about the end of the singers relationship with her boyfriend and became her first No.1 and was also performed live on the 2011 Brit Awards. Name the song and the singer.
