Give your answers based on the following definitions (Oxford English Dictionary) or information. All are single-words begin with PAL.

- 1a:** A mattress made of sacking or other strong material filled with straw or the like. **Palliasse**
- 1b:** A light golden-brown or tan-coloured horse with a white or pale mane and tail, originally bred in the south-western U.S. **Palamino**
- 2a:** One of the three native newt species to be found in the UK. **Palmate**
- 2b:** In modern forms of the Charlemagne romances: any of the twelve peers or most famed warriors of Charlemagne's court. Hence: a knight renowned for heroism and chivalry; a famous champion. **Paladin**

- 1a:** This gulf extends into Greece from the Mediterranean, it is linked to the Aegean Sea by a canal with the same name. Gulf of **Corinth**
- 1b:** This gulf forms the northernmost arm of the Baltic Sea between Sweden and Finland. Gulf of **Bothnia**
- 2a:** This gulf is a large, shallow sea enclosed on three sides by northern Australia and bounded on the north by the Arafura Sea. To the east is Cape York Peninsula, Queensland; to the west Arnhem Land, Northern Territory. Gulf of **Carpentaria**
- 2b:** This gulf is the world's largest estuary and gives access to sea-going vessels into the Great Lakes system of North America and Canada. Gulf of **Saint Lawrence**
