- 2A** Which country was the first to allow women to vote, in 1893? **NEW ZEALAND**
- 2B** In which year did the Limehouse Declaration herald the birth of the British Social Democratic Party? One year either way allowed **1981** (allow **1980** to **1982**)
- 3A** Deriving from the Latin word for 'the common people', and very similar in meaning to 'referendum', what word describes a vote offered to the entire electorate on a single issue of overwhelming importance? **PLEBISCITE**
- 3B** Which country, by means of the practically bloodless Carnation Revolution of 1974, overthrew a dictator and established a democracy? **PORTUGAL**
- 4A** In which country did the Velvet Revolution of 1989 establish a democracy? **CZECHOSLOVAKIA**
- 4B** Which Prime Minister declared that 'democracy is the worst form of Government, apart from all the others'? Sir Winston **CHURCHILL**
