Ans. Rafael **Nadal** (Uncle is Miguel Nadal)

1. B Current Dutch international footballer whose clubs have included Ajax and Manchester United. His father once broke Paul Gascoigne's cheek bone in an international match?
Ans. Daley **Blind** (his father was Danny Blind)

2. A Current England one-day international cricketer whose father played for Northants and England and later became a test match umpire? Ans. David **Willey** (Father is Peter Willey)

2. B The grandson of a legendary England batsman and bon viveur of the mid twentieth century. This cricketer has opened the batting for Somerset, England and currently Middlesex.
Ans. Nick **Compton** (Grandad was Denis Compton.)

3. A Brothers who occupied opposite wings for the England Rugby Union team in the 1990s, both pursuing careers as pilots, one in the RAF and one for Easyjet? Ans. Rory and Tony **Underwood**

3. B Father and son were both leading showjumpers. The father, who was also a wrestler, was disciplined for an unacceptable gesture at the judges in 1971? Ans. Harvey and Robert **Smith**

4. A Four brothers who have all been Rugby League professionals in the UK and represented the same club in Australia. One brother made a short and uncelebrated foray into Rugby Union?
Ans. **Burgess** (Sam, George, Tom and Luke)

4. B Both are Formula One World Champions? The son has German nationality while his father was from Finland. Ans. Nico **Rosberg** (Father Keke)

Spares: 1. A South African fast bowler, following in his father's footsteps. His Uncle is generally regarded as the best South African batsman of all time? Ans. Shaun **Pollock** (His father was Peter and his uncle was Graham)

1 B. Andy Warhol worked on the graphic presentation of several LP Record sleeves. On a 1969 Rolling Stones album, the sleeve was unique in that it included a real zipper as part of the design. What is the title of the album? Ans. **Sticky Fingers.**

2 A. Name either of the husband and wife artist team, who collaborated to produce the cover of the Beatles "Sergeant Peppers Lonely Arts Club Band". Answer- **Peter Blake** and **Jann Haworth**

2 B. Name the German associate, illustrator and friend of the Beatles who produced the line drawing, cover art for their album "Revolver" and appears on the cover. Answer.- **Klaus Voormann.**

3 A. 1969 album from the English rock band The Who. The first double LP to be considered a "Rock Opera" in that it consists of different themes and movements connected to a story about a child who is traumatised and becomes temporarily deaf, dumb and blind. What is the album title?
Answer .- "**Tommy**".

3 B. Female artist who, alongside other practitioners, explored optical effects. How flat surfaces can be treated to create the illusion of curves or undulation. This became known as "OP ART". What is her name? Answer.- **Bridget Riley**

4 A. Fashion model who rocketed to international stardom during the 1960s. Her professional name was "Twiggy" but what was her real name? Answer - **Lesley Hornby.**

4 B. English fashion designer who is generally credited with designing the "Mini Skirt" and designed "Hot pants" in the early 1970s. What is her name? Answer- **Mary Quant.**

Spare 1. 1968 album from English pop/rock band The Small Faces. The LP had a distinctive, circular, folding cover designed to look like an early 20th Century tobacco tin and featured narration from Professor Stanley Unwin. What is the album title? Answer.- "**Ogden's Nut Gone Flake**".

Spare 2. A prominent member of the British "POP ART" movement during its formative years in the 1960s. This Scottish/Italian sculptor, printmaker produced the artwork for Paul McCartney's "Red Rose Speedway" album. He designed the "Whitworth Tapestry" for Manchester Art Gallery and later the mosaics for Tottenham Court Road tube station London. What is his name? Answer- **Eduardo Paolozzi.**
