2a	Anglo-Irish satirist and champion of liberty. For many years Dean of St Patrick's Anglican Cathedral Dublin until his death in 1745.	Jonathan <b>Swift</b>
2b	Catholic born metaphysical poet who became a Church of England cleric. Dean of St Paul's Cathedral, London for many years until his death in 1631.	John <b>Donne</b>
