<b>1b</b>	One half of BBC comedy show "The Mary Whitehouse Experience", this pair have forged their own careers, but continue to work together, notably appearing through 64 series of Radio 4's 'The Now Show'.	<u>Steve PUNT and Hugh DENNIS</u>
<b>2a</b>	He was her press secretary from 1979 until 1990 despite having earlier stood for election as a representative of the Labour Party.	<u>Margaret THATCHER and Bernard INGHAM</u>
<b>2b</b>	Lancaster architects 1868 – 1886, renowned chiefly for restoring or designing churches mostly, but not exclusively in the northwest of England.	<u>PALEY and AUSTIN</u>
<b>3a</b>	Famous novelists in their own rights, this pair reported on their 1857 holiday in Cumberland in 'Household Words'. In their reports they appeared as Thomas Idle and Francis Goodchild. Their journalism was later published as 'The Lazy Tour of Two Idle Apprentices'.	<u>Charles DICKENS and Wilkie COLLINS</u>
<b>3b</b>	This 'big man, little man' striking partnership played together 190 times for Liverpool in the early 1970s.	<u>Kevin KEEGAN and John TOSHACK</u>
